Harvard Medical School Promotions



Megha Gupta, MD, MS, Maternal-Fetal Medicine, was promoted to Assistant Professor of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Biology at Harvard Medical School.

Dr. Gupta earned her medical degree from The Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine. She completed her residency at Penn State Health Milton S. Hershey Medical Center, her fellowship at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center in Los Angeles, and is board-certified in Maternal-Fetal Medicine by the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology. Dr. Gupta's clinical focus is caring for critically ill pregnant patients with thrombotic microangiopathies and applying maternal point-of-care ultrasound (POCUS). Her research explores the application of maternal POCUS in high-acuity pregnant and postpartum patients. She is the Principal Investigator of a study funded by the William F. Milton Fund to verify the feasibility of maternal POCUS and establish normal values for maternal lung, heart, and abdominal views during pregnancy and postpartum. Dr. Gupta is also the Principal Investigator for a Massachusetts Life Sciences Center-funded project to assess left ventricular ejection fraction in pregnant and postpartum patients using a novel handheld ultrasound device with an artificial intelligence-assisted algorithm.



Stephen Wagner, MD, Academic Specialist in General Obstetrics and Gynecology, was promoted to Assistant Professor of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Biology at Harvard Medical School.

Dr. Wagner earned his medical degree from The Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine and completed his residency at Penn State Health Milton S. Hershey Medical Center. He has a distinguished record of mentoring and training medical students and recently received the 2024 CREOG National Faculty Award for Excellence in Resident Education.

Recognized as one of Boston Magazine's 2025 list of Top Doctors, Dr. Wagner is also a member of Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society, The American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology, and the Society for Academic Specialists in General Obstetrics and Gynecology, serving as member of the Research Committee and Chair of their Research Awards Subcommittee.

Global Health: Updates from Botswana

Rebecca Luckett, MD, MPH, OBGYN at BIDMC and the Botswana Harvard Partnership in Botswana, announced the enrollment of the first participant in the HOPE-II vaccine trial. This international, multi-site clinical trial, hosted by Massachusetts General Hospital and funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, evaluates the efficacy of a single-dose HPV vaccination in young women with HIV. Dr. Luckett serves as the site Principal Investigator for the Botswana site, with additional study sites in South Africa and Rwanda. The trial aims to enroll 750 participants, including 250 from Botswana.
