


Dr. Diana Litmanovich Named Chair of the American Heart Association's Council on Cardiovascular Radiology & Intervention

Dr. Chang's application was among the top-ranked and approved for seed funding by the Foundation's Board of Trustees. In support of Dr. Chang's radiologic research, the Foundation will provide \$60,000 to be used as a 1-year grant, effective July 1, 2025.

The American Heart Association (AHA) has approved an Innovative Project Award for **Dr. Marwan Moussa's** project entitled "Paradigm Shift in Primary Aldosteronism Management Utilizing Cell-Free DNA." The Innovative Project Award promotes unexplored ideas, and "research deemed innovative may introduce a new paradigm, challenge current paradigms, look at existing problems from new perspectives, or exhibit other uniquely creative qualities."

Dr. Moussa has received a two-year, \$200,000 award to support his research.
