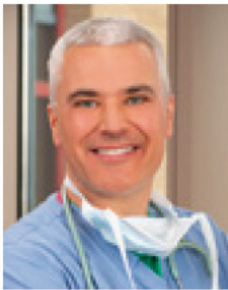

Dr. Todd Sarge, Vice Chair of Critical Care, is the inaugural recipient of the new endowed Chair that will support education and research in Critical Care at BIDMC, **“The Alan Lisbon, MD Chair in Critical Care at BIDMC.”** The new Chair is named in honor of Dr. Alan Lisbon, who has been in the department since 1976. Dr. Lisbon was the driving force that created the department’s strong presence in BIDMC ICUs and set a standard for clinical excellence and collaboration that continues today.



Dr. Feroze Mahmood was awarded the prestigious **Arthur E. Weyman Award** by the Society of Cardiovascular Anesthesiologists in 2026, recognizing outstanding contributions to the field of cardiovascular anesthesiology and perioperative echocardiography. As part of this honor, Dr. Mahmood delivered a featured lecture titled *“TEE – A Journey in Time: From Echocardiography to Echocardiology”* during the Annual SCA Echo Week in Atlanta. The lecture highlighted the evolution of transesophageal echocardiography and its expanding role in advancing perioperative cardiac care.

Research



Dr. Valluvan Rangasamy is the recipient of the 2026 John Hedley-Whyte Research Fellowship. Administered through the Eleanor and Miles Shore Faculty Development Awards Program at HMS, this fellowship is a prestigious one-year award that supports the advancement of innovative research projects led by faculty in the BIDMC Department of Anesthesia, Critical Care and Pain Medicine. Dr. Rangasamy's project will focus on studying temporal dynamics of EEG, cerebral autoregulation, and blood pressure in postoperative delirium and cognitive outcomes in frail surgical patients.
