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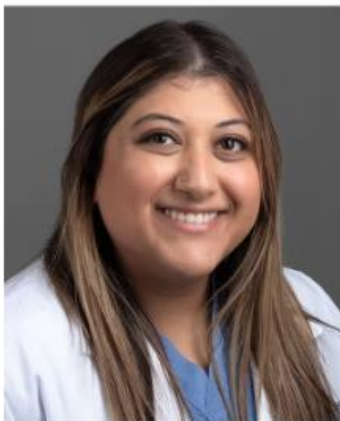

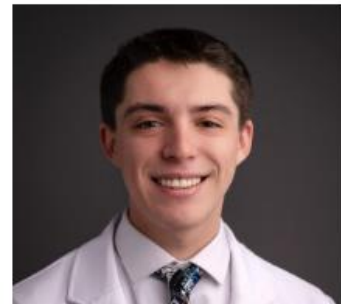

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Department Highlights



Operation FASTBALL Brings Together More Than 400 Participants for Largest Disaster Exercise to Date

The **BIDMC Disaster Medicine Fellowship** recently conducted the largest iteration of its nationally recognized full-scale disaster exercise; this year named Operation FASTBALL. The exercise took place on June 15th at Polar Park in Worcester, MA, and involved a full-scale active attacker preparedness exercise designed to educate disaster medicine fellows while strengthening emergency response readiness across Massachusetts.

The exercise brought together more than 400 participants from healthcare, emergency management, law enforcement, fire and EMS, public safety, academia, and the community to simulate an integrated response to a complex coordinated attack. Many participating agencies had previously completed the Active Attack Integrated Response (AAIR) course delivered by the fellowship in partnership with the Massachusetts Municipal Police Training Committee.

Led by **Gregory Ciottone, MD, Amalia Voskanyan, MD, and the Disaster Medicine Fellowship team**, the exercise would not have been possible without the extraordinary collaboration and support of Worcester Police, Worcester Fire, Worcester EMS, the Massachusetts State Police, and numerous local and state partners.

While these exercises serve as a cornerstone of disaster medicine education, they also play a critical role in enhancing preparedness, coordination, and response capabilities across our communities. Congratulations and thank you to everyone involved in making this milestone exercise possible.

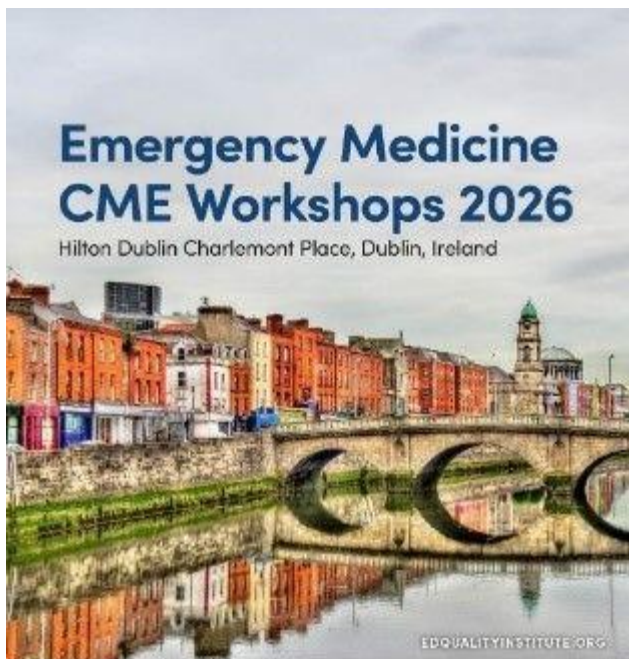
Celebrating Excellence Across Our Department

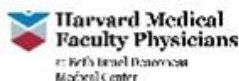

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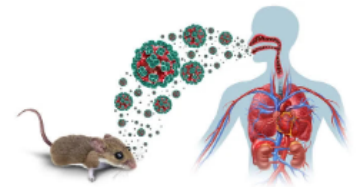
