Workforce Expansion to Support Cancer Imaging Growth

To support increasing clinical demand associated with the Dana-Farber Beth Israel Deaconess Cancer Collaboration, BIDMC-HMFP Radiology has recruited **42 radiologists over the past 18 months** and continues active recruitment across multiple subspecialties.

Nuclear Medicine Go-Live at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute

As of July 1, BIDMC-HMFP radiologists assumed responsibility for interpretation of all Nuclear Medicine imaging performed on Dana-Farber-owned imaging equipment. This marks the first major clinical go-live milestone in the Dana-Farber Beth Israel Deaconess Cancer Collaboration.

Expansion of Breast Imaging Services

Beginning July 15, BIDMC-HMFP Radiology assumes responsibility for all Dana-Farber Breast Imaging consultative services. On August 1, professional interpretation of all Breast Imaging studies performed on Dana-Farber-owned equipment will transition to BIDMC-HMFP radiologists.

Expansion of Chest and Abdominal Imaging Services

On August 1, BIDMC-HMFP Radiology will assume Chest and Abdominal Imaging consultative services and begin interpreting a portion of cross-sectional imaging studies performed on Dana-Farber-owned equipment.

Cancer Imaging Fellowship Integration

The department is integrating six Dana-Farber Cancer Imaging Fellows into HMFP clinical operations. Fellows will begin working alongside HMFP faculty in August 2026 and will transition exclusively to HMFP faculty supervision following the September clinical transition.

Breast Imaging Innovation

The Breast Imaging section implemented software supporting Contrast-Enhanced Mammography Stereotactic Biopsy, expanding advanced breast imaging capabilities.
